









OVERALL RISK ASSESSMENT

A risk analysis will be conducted for each activity.







HEALTHCARE

- First aid station at the campsite
 - Treatment of minor injuries
 - Assessment and referral (if necessary) to either infirmary or local emergency room/hospital
 - Available first aid team for response on-site
- Infirmary at one of the schools
 - Camp doctor and healthcare personnel available
 - Resting lounge
- Local emergency room and hospital
- Emergency dental



LISTENING EAR


NORTH Ordinary





TO PATH: Public transportation

- All entry points are accessible by public transport.
- Transport options can be found at national platform EnTur:

July 22nd: Arrival Day of Path

April 23rd: 90 days prior to arrival

(earliest purchase)

March 24th: 120 days prior to arrival

(good data on travel options)

FROM PATH: buses (boats and trains)

- Transportation from path to the main camp is organized by Roverway.
- Will be done mostly by buses picking Rovers up at the path exit points
- Some will travel by boat (sailing or ferries)
- Some will travel by public transport

This is coordinated by the Path and Logistics
Departments and path leaders or ISTs used as
staff the paths will travel with the participants.

PATHS






- 95 paths in total
- Some paths will be hosted by Norwegian guides & scouts organisations
- Others will be held with the help of international guides & scouts organisations and ISTs
- Patrols will organise their transport to the paths themselves. Later this
 afternoon we will have an allocated time slot for this.

- All paths are required to bring first aid equipment and communication tools if necessary
- We will have a crisis management plan and a crisis team based in Stavanger


RISK AT PATH

- The path leaders are responsible for safety on the path
- Safety department will assist and guide
- HQ will be operational throughout the path period
- Local authorities and volunteers will provide assistance where necessary
- Different levels within the path




MAIN CAMP STAVANGER

- Southwest of Norway
- Fourth largest city in Norway with approx. 150.000 inhabitants

MAIN CAMP FACILITIES





- 96 showers
- 210 toilets
- All showers and toilets are cubicles, either unisex or female.
- There are two shower areas at the campsite.
- The Norwegian scouts recommend to shower only every other day due to lower humidity and lower temperatures.

Focuses on different themes:



MAIN CAMP

PLAZA

Food houses:

- Happy with the applications for the food houses
- As of now we have food houses from Germany, Cyprus, Switzerland and the Netherlands.
- There will be a rainbow cafe!

Contingent tents:

 Some have ordered contingent tents, others will bring their own tents.



MAIN CAMP FOOD

We serve all planning staff and IST in an indoor cafeteria. Participants prepare food in their units. Some representatives collect food for each meal at the distribution point. Breakfast and lunch consist of simple and nutritious foods with spreads.

Dinner consists of sous-vide prepared dishes cooked in plastic bags for 45 minutes. Allergies are taken into consideration, and special diets receive individual portion bags of ready-made meals. Those for whom we cannot serve pre-prepared meals eat in the staff canteen.

PERSONAL EQUIPMENT (1/2)

CLOTHING:

- Woolen socks
- Woolen leggings and shirt (thermal)
- Hat (warm)
- Gloves
- Buff/Scarf
- Guide or Scout uniform
- Guide or Scout necker
- Change of clothes (11 days)
- Sweater wool or fleece
- Underwear and socks
- Shorts
- Hiking pants
- Swimming-suit
- Towel
- Shoes for good weather (sneakers)
- Good shoes for bad weather (waterproof walking/hiking boots above the ankle)
- Cap/sun hat
- Raincoat/Waterproof jacket (Shell) 15 000mm
- Rainpants/ Waterproof pants (Shell) 15 000 mm





DOCUMENTS:

- Credit card (Visa/Mastercard)
- ID card or passport (+ printed copy of all your documents)
- Health insurance card (CNS) (+ printed copy)
- Travel insurance card/documentation
- Pen and paper

SLEEPING:

- Sleeping bag (comfort temperature minimum 5°C)
- Sleeping mattress (Carrymat)
- Pillow (optional)

ELECTRICITY:

- Mobile + Charger + Powerbank
- Electric converter
 (Type C and F are used in Norway)
- Torch/Flashlight/Headlamp

PERSONAL EQUIPMENT (2/2)

OTHER:

- Personal Medication (if needed)
- Sunglasses
- Plates (2 flat and 2 deep), mug and cutlery
- Wash Kit (for clothes)
- Toiletries
- Insect protection/bug repellent
- First aid travel kit
- Sunscreen & after sun
- Water bottle
- Thermos
- Sitting mat
- Day bag/backpack
- Drybags
- Guiding and scouting knife (Keep it in your bag when not using it for program activities)

FUN STUFF:

- Swaps (badges/neckers to swap)
- Playing cards





IMPORTANT PACKING TIPS:

- Understand that if you are going on a dynamic path, you need to carry your backpack for a long time. In addition, there might be path-specific needs that will be communicated later.
- In the case of luggage delay, you should take extra precautions, e.g. wearing mountain boots on the plane, wearing a warm coat. Basically be able to survive 2-3 days in the Norwegian climate without your big rucksack.

TENTS & PATROL MATERIAL





ABOUT THE TENTS:

Patrol members share tents; <u>max 2</u> <u>tents per patrol.</u> Total number of sleeping spots should not exceed the patrol size.

Tents' features:

- Must include necessary guidelines (guy lines) and stakes for secure setup.
- Should be sturdy, waterproof, and wind-resistant to withstand Norwegian weather.

MATERIAL FOR THE PATROL:

- Tent pegs (X or Y pegs) (maximum 30 cm) you need many to stormproof your tent in the wind gusts as it could be 15m/s
- Tent Repair kit
- Bread knife x2
- Cutting knife x3
- Cutting board x 5
- Dishwashing tub
- Dishtowel
- Dish sponge/dish brush
- Environmental friendly dish soap

PATROL LEADER - ROLE





- Each Patrol Leader is responsible for collecting and keeping safe (during the whole period of the Roverway) the following documents of all their patrol members:
- Original of Autorisation parentale
- Original of Fiche médicale
- Copy of Pass / ID Card
- Copy of Vaccination card
- Each PL is in direct contact with their Path Leader. <u>This Communication</u> does not go via the CMT
- The Patrol leader is in direct contact with the CMT.
- Assist and be a supporter of his patrol! :-)
